Create new life for used equipment... and enhance the life of another... at the same time.

Assistive Technology (AT) is any device or service that increases, maintains, or improves the functional capabilities of individuals with disabilities. The result? Greater mobility, control, and independence... at home, at school, at work, and in the community.

If you or someone you know has a need for

home medical equipment or AT devices but has limited insurance coverage or financial resources, you may be able to secure what you need through the Changing



We work with local Agencies on Aging and various human service organizations to provide a seamless system of support for individuals who might benefit from receiving restored and refurbished equipment. All equipment is distributed on a first-come, firstserved basis. All is provided free of charge.

The equipment is redistributed one of two ways:

- The individual picks up the equipment at the Changing Hands center.
- If an individual is unable to collect the equipment independently, Changing Hands will help identify someone who may be able to assist.

A partial listing of the types of AT equipment and devices we redistribute on a regular basis includes, but is not limited to:

- walkers
- hoyer lifts
- bath seats and toilet seats
- transfer benches and transfer boards
- manual and power wheelchairs
- scooters
- daily living aids (items for eating, dressing, etc.)
- canes and crutches
- adapted telephones
- communication devices
- assistive listening devices
- blind/low vision aids
- adaptive games and recreational devices



Changing Hands does not loan equipment. If you are awaiting funding approval, you may

accept our equipment as your own, and then donate it back to the program once funding for the new equipment becomes available.

Pennsylvania residents of all ages who have a need for equipment, but do not have the financial means or a funding source to obtain it, are welcome to participate in the Changing Hands equipment reuse program. Due to liability issues, individuals may be required to provide a prescription or therapist's recommendation to obtain certain items.

Changing Hands operates primarily in Central PA. However, donations will be accepted and distributed to anyone throughout the state, as long as suitable arrangements can be made.

Who can donate?

We accept donations* from individuals, families, businesses, and other organizations looking to find a new home for perfectly good items they can no longer use.

If you have home medical equipment or an AT device that has served your purpose... but still has a lot of life left in it... please consider** donating it to Changing Hands.

If you have a question as to whether or not we will accept a particular item, contact us directly as indicated on the back of this brochure.

*All equipment donations are tax-deductible.

**Note that we do not accept or exchange computer equipment, stair glides, hospital beds, or power equipment that is non-operational (unless it is due to battery failure).
